Ken Balut, 359 Bruck Ave.: We, the citizens, are subsidizing the YMCA. Tell the public that this is occurring. Why should that be happening? Our Recreation Dept. should take over the YMCA programs. The contract should be broken with the YMCA. Have we received any audit from them recently? Have they turned the Jefferson St. property back to the City?

Alan Silber, 244 Rector St.: The public safety complex building never went out for bid. This was built for one entity only--the YMCA. They owe us over \$1million. The City maintains the YMCA, but they don't share with the City what they take in. There should be a running tally on what they owe to the City.

Sharon Hubberman, 529 Cornell St.: What is this about? What components are being changed or added? Is there an addendum to the resolution that describes the changes in more detail?

Council Member Petrick: A Master Plan is required by State Law. We have been working on this for over 5 years. It is an ever changing document. This addresses the parks in the City. This would allow us to get additional grants. The last Master Plan was adopted under the previous administration. There will be a continuation of the review of the Master Plan even after it is adopted.

Council Member Gonzalez: I have not had a chance to read this. Mr. Petrick has a personal interest in this and he might have to abstain from the vote. We should have a public hearing on this matter because it affects the entire City.

Reinaldo Aviles, 16 Harbor Terr.: The Historic Preservation Commission would have liked to have seen this document before the Council adopted this. It needs further discussion.

Peter Pelissier: The Parking Utility Manager and the vendor are here to offer info and answer questions the Council may have.

Chet Wilkolaski, Amano McGann Inc. - Provided an overview of the company's current service to the City and the proposed future service. He described how the solar power pay stations work. He indicated that there will be no issues with the battery that gets solar power. He indicated payments can be made via smartphone. However, this is done by a separate company. He advised that they will integrate with them to provide the service. That will be a separate contract. There is a one year warranty on the pay stations and they offer additional coverage thereafter at a cost.

Jeannette Rios, Parking Utility Manager: We will implement the payment by phone in the future.

Council Member Irizarry: I have a concern because this is a proprietary item. Is there any way to get around that?

Chet Wilkolaski: We are the largest parking meter company in the world.

Jeannette Rios: We've had great past experience with this company.

Council Member Irizarry: How long will it take us to make our money back on this expenditure?

Jeannette Rios: We will make the money back in 3 to 4 months.

Chet Wilkolaski: Several towns in NJ use these meters.

Council Member Pabon: What type of access do our technicians have for parts and how many technicians do we have?

Chet Wilkolaski: We would deliver the parts the same day or the next day.

Jeannette Rios: We have two technicians.

Council Member Petrick: Is there any salvage value for the present equipment?

Chet Wilkolaski: None. We will set the pay stations up in both English and Spanish.

Stan Sierakowski, 679 Charles St.: What is the status of my OPRA request for the RFP's for legal services? If I am denied the documents, I can go to the GRC or the Superior Court to appeal my case.

Arlene Q. Perez: The response is due on December 11. RFP's are opened in the public eye. Everyone is welcome to be present when they get opened.

Nelvi Caba, 84 Washington St.: I complain about the Police Dept. and no one does anything and nobody calls me back. My vans get damaged due to vandalism. I am removing my vans from the City's parking lot because of all the damage that was occurring there. I lost a lot of money in that parking lot. Jeannette Rios is not returning my money for the rent I paid, after I removed my vans.

Ken Balut, 359 Bruck Ave.: There was no bid on the parking meters. The Attorney and BA should not be texting during the meeting. I submit OPRA's and they are not being filled. Everyone is lying here. Civil Service Rules have been violated.

Susan Batista, 1074 Truxton Dr.: Ms. Perez is in contempt of Court in my case. She did not show up for my hearing yesterday. How much has been spent by the City on my case already? This case could have been settled.

Arlene Q. Perez: I was not obligated to be at the hearing. The city is being represented by the DeCotiis firm in the Batista matter.

Sharon Hubberman, 529 Cornell St.: There's a live electrical box near the water on Water St. Who authorized the installation of the box there? Please look into that matter. An election cycle is coming up in 2016. We are a non-partisan town. I encourage an ordinance/resolution that will penalize any person that does not respect the law with regard to elections.

Council President Nanton: That box is being moved. Please provide me with any election material that shows that election laws were violated in the past.

Sharon Hubberman: I will do that.

Reinaldo Aviles, 16 Harbor Terr.: Having council meetings every week gives people time to review information and be more informed. That might be the way to go. You also may want to consider meetings on Mondays and Thursdays of the same week, instead of Monday and Wednesday.

Alan Silber, 244 Rector St.: Closed Session resolutions should be more specific as to why the Council is going into Closed Session. The City has been brought to Court in the past. You need to be more specific than just listing the word "litigation" in the resolution.

BUSINESS ADMINISTRATOR/LAW DIRECTOR/MAYOR COMMENTS

Arlene Q. Perez: We will list out litigation matters going forward for Closed Session. I just want to reinforce that the DeCotiis law firm is a very reputable firm that represents many municipalities in the State.

Peter Pelissier: The Christmas Tree Lighting was one of the best ever. The Adler Building on outer High St. is being subdivided into 2 businesses and will increase revenues and jobs. The Bd. of Education is not understanding the urgency of the connector road. Any help from the Council will be appreciated. We have received several applications for the BA position. We will be reviewing them and sending out questionnaires. The CFO was called disingenuous this evening. She is a hard worker and saves the City much money as a result of her diligence.

COUNCIL COMMENTS

Council Member Gonzalez: The smell from the chicken place on Amboy Ave. has gotten worse. Please have their permits removed. There's a problem with the dumpsters at the Harbortown property. Those dumpsters should be moved to the back of the property. They use private haulers but the City reimburses them for garbage collection. When will we get a summary of legal cases from the Law Dept.?

Arlene Q. Perez: I submitted a report last month. The only thing you haven't received is the Worker's Comp cases.

Council Member Gonzalez: Some locations have driveway curb cuts with no actual driveway. People are getting ticketed for parking there. How is that handled?

Larry Cattano, Deputy Police Chief: Get me the specific addresses and I will look into it. If anyone has received a ticket they should go to court and fight it.

Council Member Gonzalez: I thank Annie Hindenlang for the report on the connector road.

Council Member Irizarry: I wish everyone a happy holiday season.

Council Member Pabon to Arlene Q. Perez: Please a send a letter to the Bd. of Ed. asking what it is that they are looking for with regard to the connector road.

Arlene Q. Perez: I will send it out.

Council Member Pabon: This is not the first time we have been addressed about the garbage issue at Harbortown. We need to follow up on things. We also need to follow up on the chicken place on Amboy Ave. The Christmas Parade was wonderful. Please go take a tour at the Proprietary House. They are decorating it and it looks beautiful.

Council Member Petrick: Please look into the fire lane at Harbortown.

Larry Cattano: We can't enforce traffic violations at Harbortown. They haven't relinquished Title 39. Maybe we can enforce it under fire codes.

Council Member Petrick: We have a Chanukah celebration tomorrow at 6pm at City Hall. Everyone is invited.

Council President Nanton: Perth Amboy is the most beautiful City at Christmastime. There are house tours on December 13 and the St. Peter's Concert is also on December 13. It is open to the public and I invite everyone.
