Tom Ward, 104 Madison Ave.: Why are the Zoning and Planning Bd. meetings not being shown on cable TV?

Council President Pabon: We are looking into it.

Arthur Brewton, 442 Convery Blvd: There is a lot of loud music being played in the downtown area. It's mostly coming from vehicles. Something should be done about that. We need more police presence in the downtown area. We need them walking the beat.

Council Member Gonzalez: We will be looking at the noise ordinance again.

Virginia Lugo, 316 State St.: I'm a BID board member. I'm opposed to the spending of monies from the BID Transitional Budget. We should have a cease and desist of the spending until a new board is elected. There is great conflict within the BID. We currently don't receive board minutes. We are targeting our election for October 1.

Council Member Irizarry: Where is the BID money coming from?

Jillian Barrick: It's from the business property owners.

Debra Foley, 213 State St.: A handicapped spot was installed near my building. The handicapped person is still living there. The care giver has changed. The sign was just removed. The Chief was contacted by Elaine. It took a long time to install the sign but it was taken down almost immediately. The sign needs to be put back.

Elaine M. Jasko, City Clerk: When Ms. Foley brought this to my attention, I advised her that I would be look into it and try to help her resolve the matter. I advised her that I would be in touch with her once I spoke to the Police Dept. about the situation.

The Council advised Elaine Jasko to continue working on the matter with Ms. Foley and to try to resolve the issue.

Neil Hunter, 358 Rector St., read a letter into the record from Kushner's attorney regarding masonry repairs at the Admiral Building.

Monica Sainz, 694 Mary St.: I want to thank you for making Mary St. one way and allowing parking on one side only. Cars are now going slower. It's fantastic. Many of my neighbors are happy about this.

Tanya Batts, 710 Mary St.: I don't mind the one way, but the one side parking is creating a hardship for the neighbors. Only 13 people signed a petition for me asking that parking be allowed on both sides of the street. I am disillusioned by this. I would be happy with resident parking stickers.

Council Member Gonzalez: There was a discussion about this on Monday. The business administrator will meet with some neighbors to see if there's a possible solution to the situation.

David Caba, 139 Lewis St.: The Council needs to be informed about a shooting that recently occurred in Perth Amboy. The quality of life in Perth Amboy is being diminished.

Angel Leon, 618 Penn St.: Has anything been done about the noise ordinance addressing loud music? Can you please translate the noise ordinance into Spanish?

Leslie Dominguez-Rodriguez, 758 Convery Blvd.: I never got a response from the Council regarding my previous request (February 2014) of making the city's municipal election a partisan election. The county paid \$34,000 for the past primary election in Perth Amboy. Making Perth Amboy partisan is the better way to go. You should place a resolution on the September agenda making this change. There's a new property owner on Chamberlain Ave. who plays his music very loudly. Residential parking stickers should be issued for Mary St.

Stan Sierakowski, 679 Charles St.: Roxanne Troche makes \$90,000 for the BID. What was her salary before she went to the BID? The BID has become a patronage pit. Is there any oversight for Ms. Troche? With regard to the Rodgers Group, they are using their influence. They are retired police personnel and want to make money when they retire.

Jillian Barrick: The BID executive director reports to me and she has an office inside of City Hall. The City subsidizes her benefits. The salary was subsidized last year by the UEZ. Therefore, the entire salary is being supported by the BID. The salary is a little less than \$90,000 per year.

Fernando Gonzalez, 129 High St.: When I was on the Council, I voted against moving the municipal election to November. In 1985, the City eliminated the runoff elections. I suggest the Council set up a charter study commission to determine whether we need a runoff election. The ballot confuses the voters. If you want to continue with an election in November, you should go partisan.

Christine Dispenziere, 358 Rector St.: There's a lot of noise at the waterfront. It usually starts at 11:00 pm. Can we get some more police presence there? There are lights that are still out near the building that have been out since Superstorm Sandy. I don't feel safe.

Council Member Gonzalez: Do we have an update on the lighting?

Frank Dann, Director DPW: It's the responsibility of the property owner.

Jillian Barrick: I will follow up on this.

Sharon Hubberman, 529 Cornell St.: At a recent BID meeting, \$10,000 cut was from the budget. There are many issues regarding the BID. The public needs to know what is occurring at the BID. I am in favor of non-partisanship.

Miriam Quiles, 761 Barry Ave.: I own property at 309 Market St. There has been another rainstorm and another backup at my property. I came to the Mayor's office and as of today, I have not received any response from the Mayor's office. Has there been a report about what occurred?

Jillian Barrick: An extensive analysis was done. We provided special bulk trash collection (July 22 and 23) at no cost to the residents. This was a flash flood.

Miriam Quiles: Will I have flooding regularly now? I have no flood insurance.

Jillian Barrick: You can't anticipate Acts of God.

Council Member Petrick to Jillian Barrick, BA: Please follow up with Mr. Risoldi of USA-PA.

Council Member Petrick: The system was overwhelmed. Ms. Quiles should get a valve installed by a plumber at her property.

Mark Blunda.: A claim can be filed for damages. The City can contact Mr. Risoldi and follow up on this.

Council President Pabon: We received a report from the water company but the residents should have been provided with some information.

Miriam Quiles: We got 2-3 feet of sewer water. Why did other parts of town not experience the Act of God? I just found out from my parents who owned this house before me that this has been going on for 20-30 years.

Council Member Gonzalez: A professional plumber should look at the clean out plugs. Has anyone checked the netting chambers?

Jillian Barrick: Yes it gets checked after a storm.

Council Member Petrick: We are working on separation of sewers in old sections of town. I don't know when this section will get done.

Mark Blunda: USA-PA can provide residents in the area, sections of the report, so they are aware of and can prepare and prevent flash flooding.

Jane Herron, 519 Groom St.: We should have a 4 way stop and humps installed. There are city trucks that took down telephone lines. There is no enforcement of ordinances. There are more ambulances on Groom and Neville Streets. They are not told to divert. There are no crosswalks in any of these streets.

Council Member Petrick: We should look into the cost of speed bumps.

COUNCIL COMMENTS

Council Member Gonzalez: We need to put on an ordinance for the Council to consider regarding tavern security.

Mark Blunda: It will be on the next agenda.

Council Member Petrick to Ken Ortiz, Director of Human Services: They want to paint a mural on the Storage container that is currently there. However, I heard a second one will be dropped there. How will anyone see the mural if a second one is put there?

Ken Ortiz: We are working on a mural ordinance. The trailer will be placed there, but it will only be placed there temporarily. The second trailer will be dropped within the next two weeks.

Council Member Gonzalez to Ken Ortiz: Your staff should be commended for the great job with Family Day.

Council Member Nanton: This Council and Administration is looking into repairing and replacing infrastructure throughout the City. I would like bullet points on how changing the election to partisan will affect voter participation.

Council Member Petrick: The Council was not in favor of moving School Elections to November.

Council Member Irizarry: Can we have a representative from the Rodgers Group at the next meeting to answer some concerns?

Council Member Gonzalez: That is a good suggestion.
